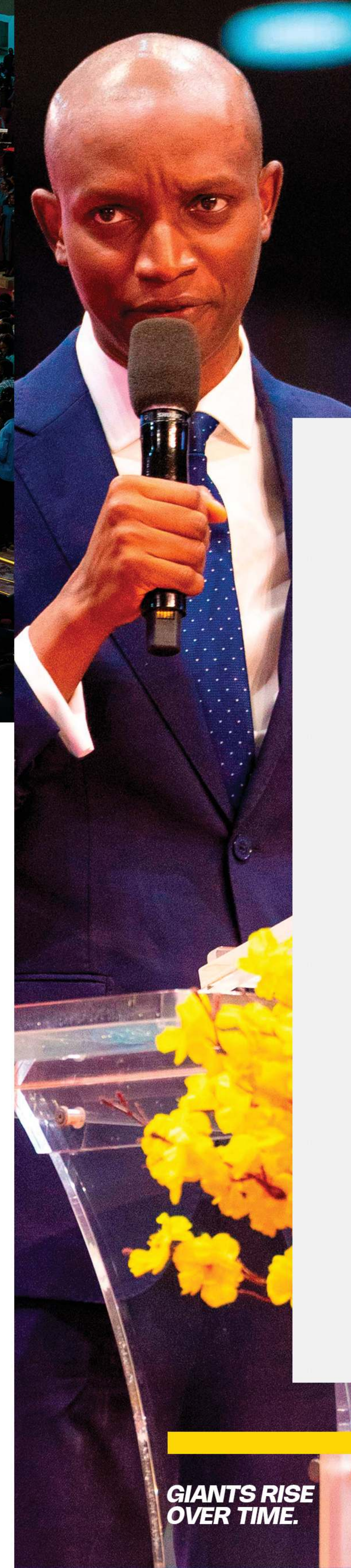

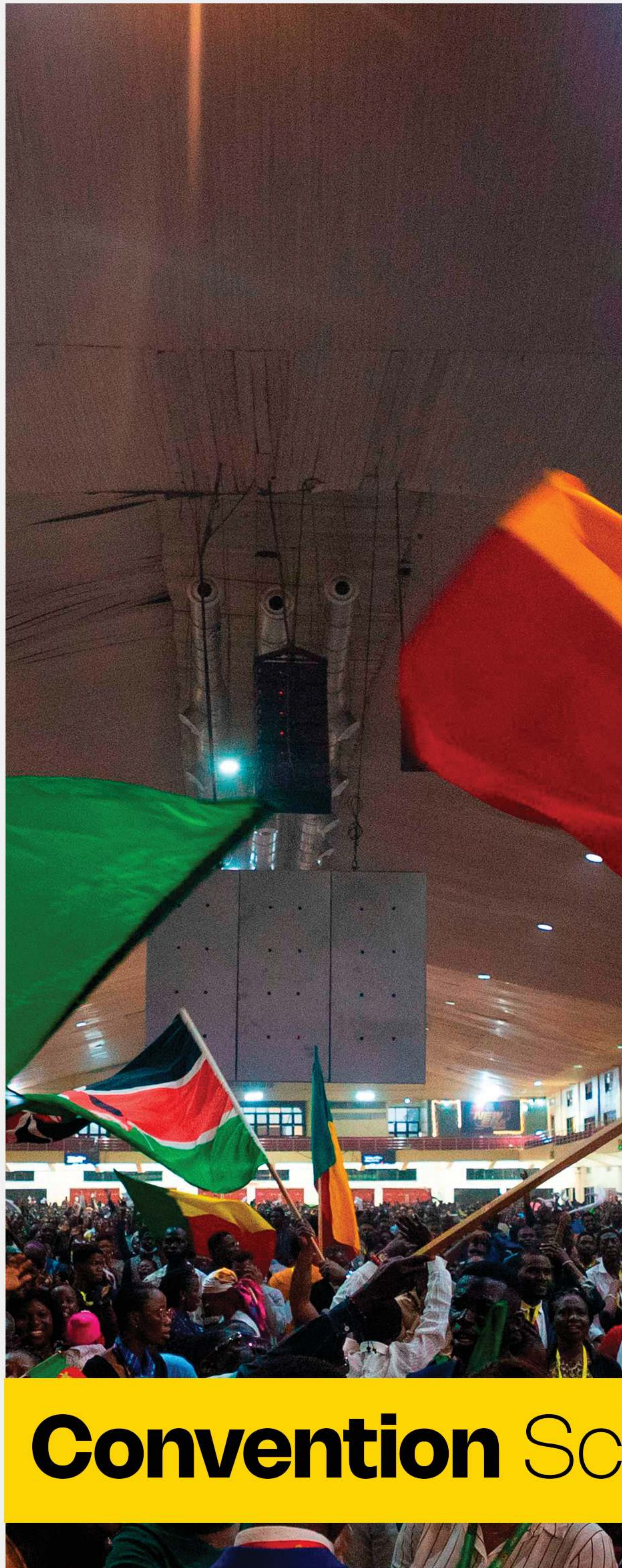

**Young Voices, Ancient Power**

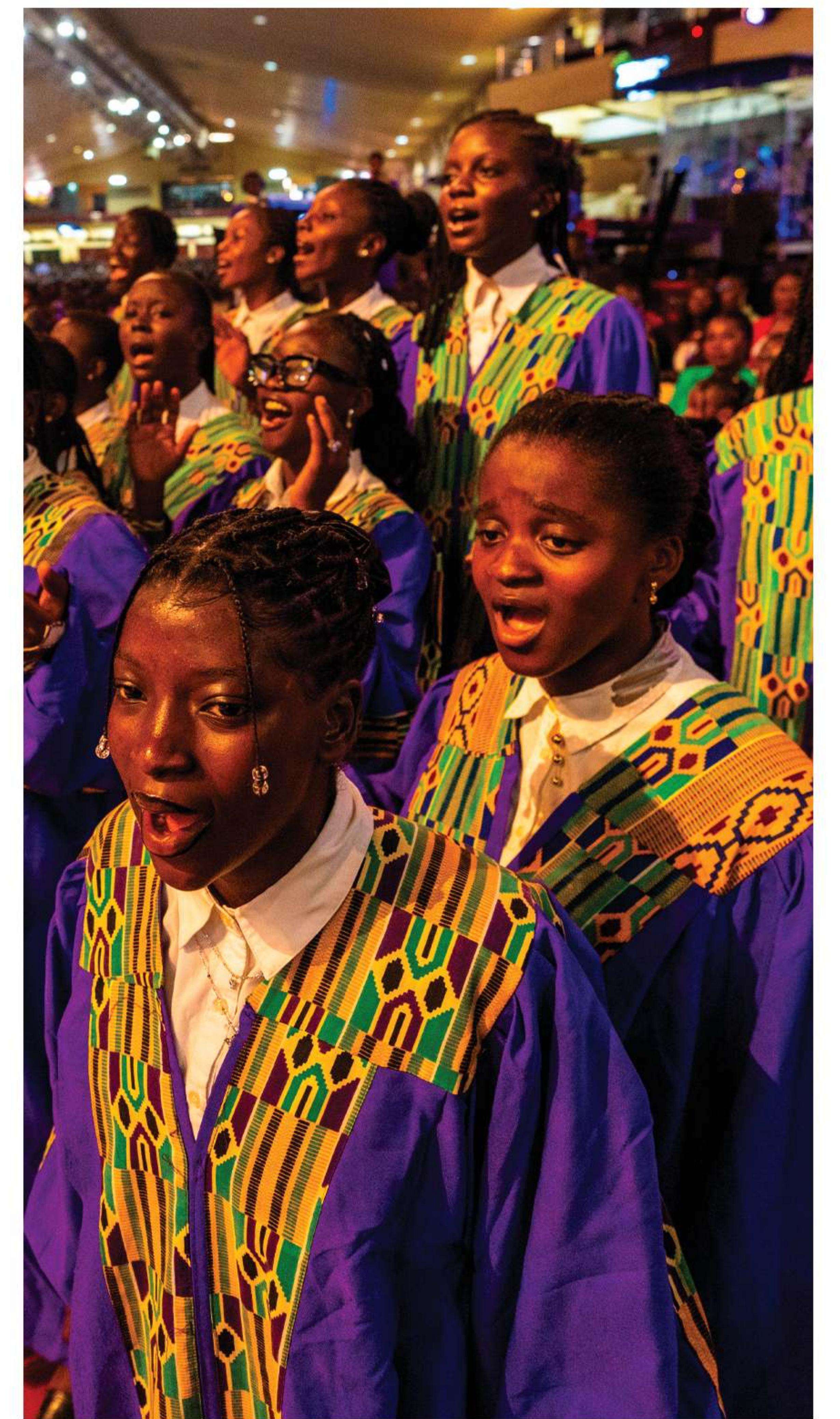

This was education wrapped in artistry. Their performance reminded everyone that sometimes the most loving thing to do is to let go before it's too late.

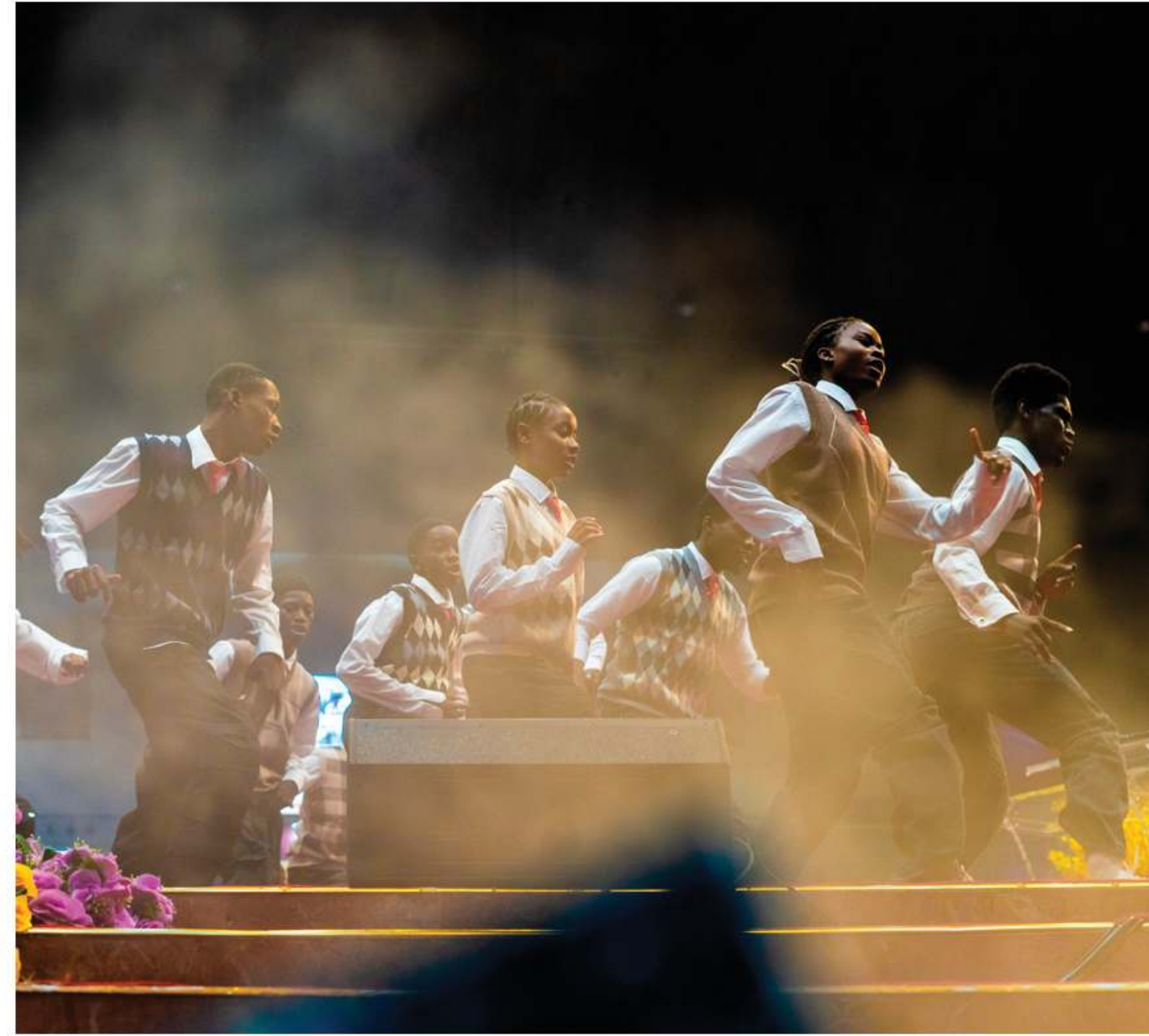

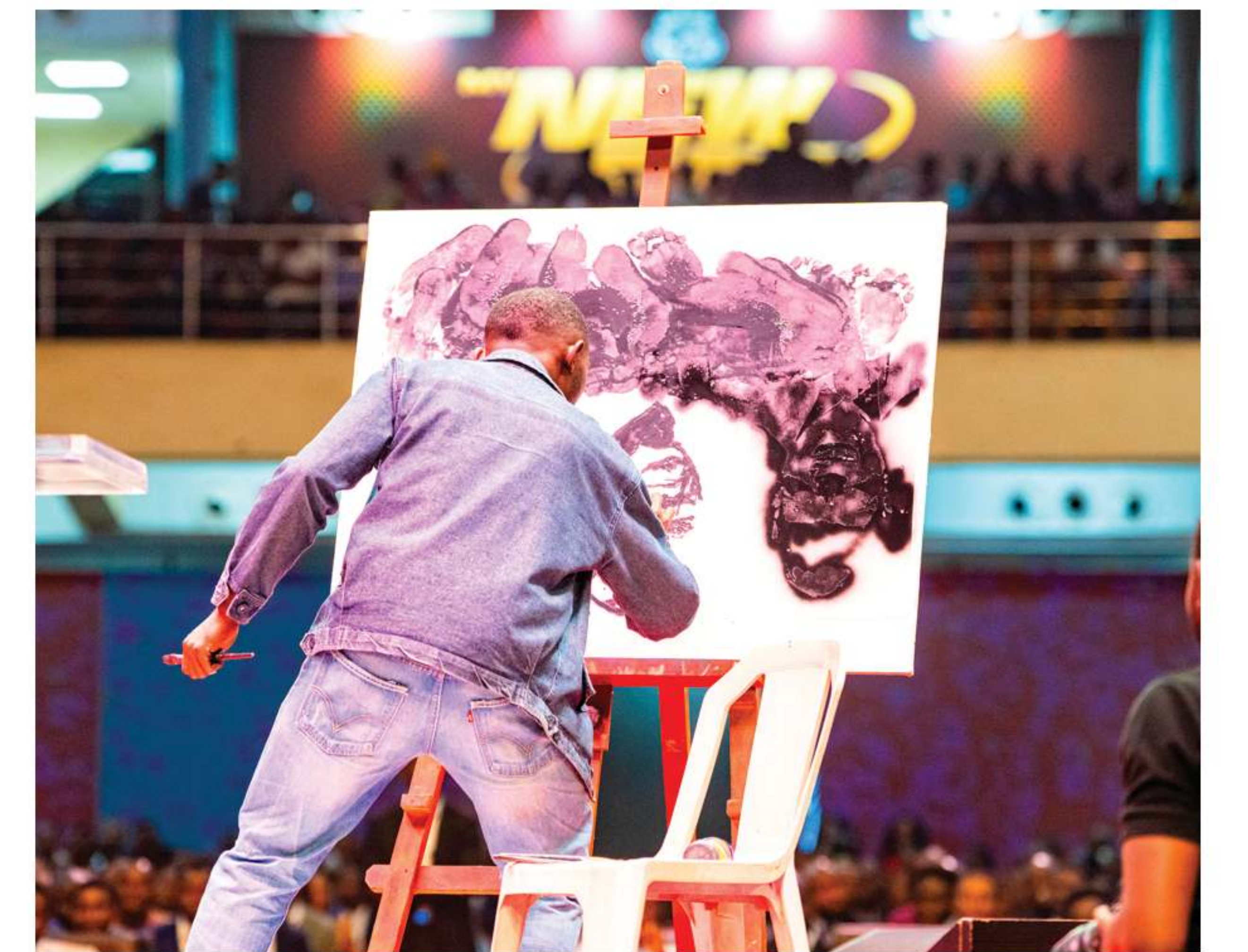
The evening climaxed when the Bishop himself signed off the painting with his autograph on this unique creation. It became heaven's stamp of approval on creativity unleashed for God's glory.

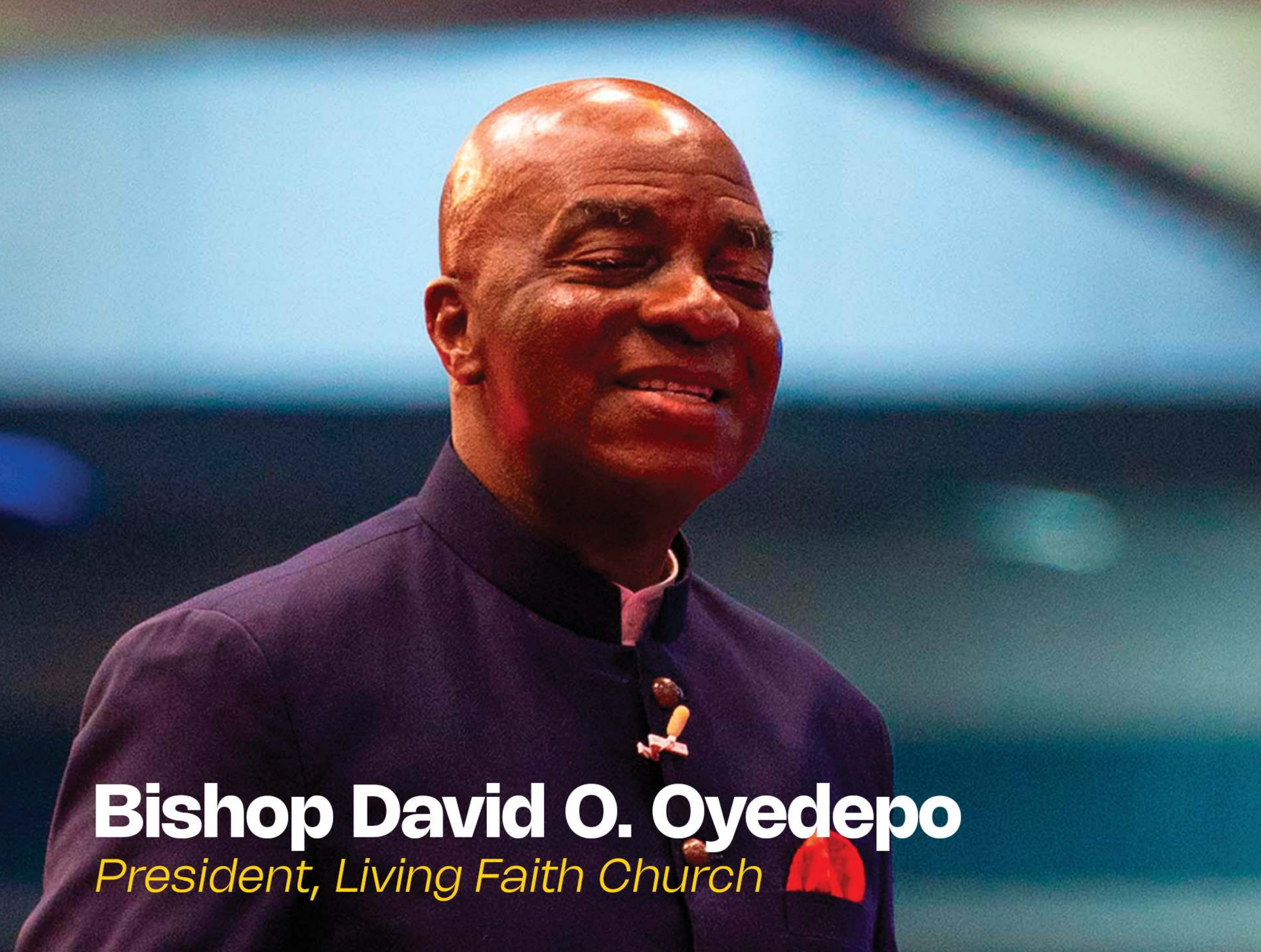

# INTERVIEWS



**Bishop David O. Oyedepo**  
*President, Living Faith Church*

In an interview session with the founder of the Living Faith Church Worldwide, the Apostle over the Commission, to whom the Mandate was delivered, Bishop David Oyedepo, he voiced a heartfelt concern about today's generation, especially the youths.

Speaking with clarity and conviction, he stressed that the future belongs only to those who prepare for it.

*"We must work towards progress," he said, "because no one ever arrives at a future they have not prepared for. Sadly, many young people today are waiting for a future they have done little to build. It is like venturing into business without any knowledge or understanding of that field."*

Drawing from his own journey, Bishop Oyedepo recalled the discipline that shaped his ministry:

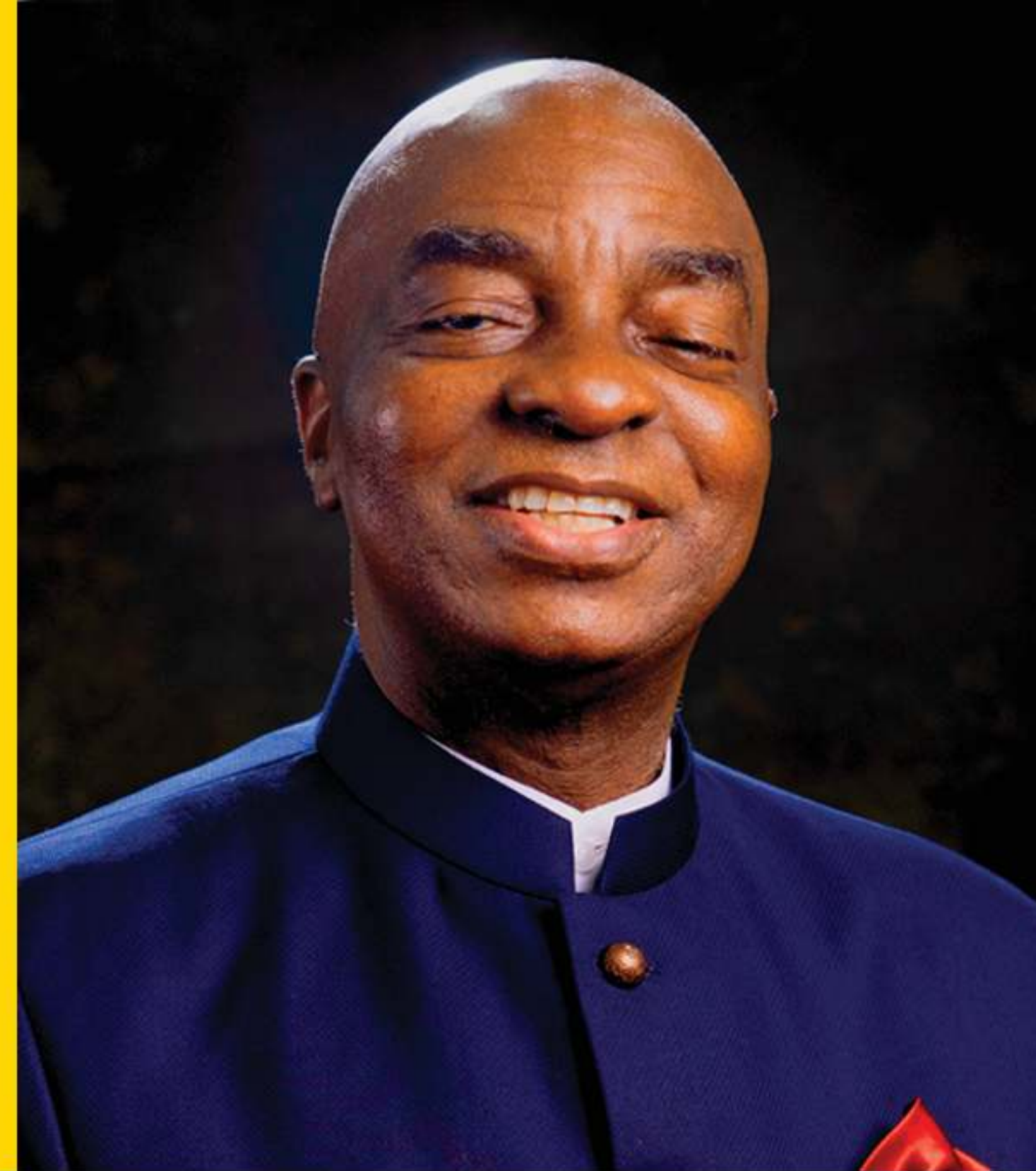
*"Before stepping fully into ministry, I read thirty-nine biographies of great ministers. I wanted to know how they began, the choices they made, and the lessons their lives could teach me. I put those lessons to work."*

From this, he urged the youth to embrace intentional learning and mentorship.

*"There is so much wisdom to draw from those who have gone ahead. Wisdom is available, but it must be sought."*

Concluding on a note of gratitude, he affirmed:

**“We give glory to God that His word still heals, transforms, and convicts souls.”**



## Mama Faith Oyedepo

*Lessons from the Journey of 43 Years*

**R**eflecting on over Forty-three years of marriage, the journey has been one of grace, growth, and deep-rooted values. One vivid memory that shaped my perspective was during a season when myself and my husband lived in a Nigerian city where the government had constructed a housing estate.

Unfortunately, it was later discovered that the buildings had been erected on a faulty foundation.

Later on, everything had to be torn down. That experience left a lasting impression on me: the importance of a firm foundation, not just in buildings, but in life and marriage. As Psalm 11:3 aptly says,

**“If the foundation be destroyed, what can the righteous do?”**

I was fortunate to be raised in a home where Christian values weren't just taught; they were lived. I never witnessed my parents fight. Instead, they modelled integrity, discipline, the fear of God, and wise financial stewardship.

Growing up, my life revolved around God's word, prayer, and fasting. These were not occasional practices but core elements of my upbringing.

Speaking about my new birth, I gave my life to Christ as a teenager, and in 1976, I was baptised in the Holy Ghost. This encounter became a turning point in my life. I had heard about the Holy Spirit, but experiencing Him personally moulded my character and deepened my foundation. With the example of my parents' marriage and the strength of my personal spiritual walk, I believed that enjoying a fruitful marriage was not only possible; it was my inheritance. My journey has been made possible by God's grace and the strong family foundation He gave me.

To the youth of today, I therefore offer heartfelt advice on how God's word should become the standard for your life so that your home and future can stand firm, even in turbulent times. In an era where many young people are seeking quick fixes – whether in wealth, fame, or success – **“Put God first,”** because where you put God determines where He will place you.

Moreover, you should choose the right associations. **“The people you surround yourself with will either make or break you.”** Secondly, relate with those who are walking the same path of purpose and righteousness.

In today's digital age, social media can bring a lot of distractions; everyone wants to be in the public eye, but beyond the image you present online, who are you within? What is your relationship with God?

**“Finally, your life is personal, and each one will give an account for how they lived. Remember to always maintain “focus”.**

# Pastor David Oyedepo Jnr

Resident Pastor, Living Faith Church, Canaanland

**M**any know him as Pastor David Oyedepo Jnr., but to others, he's simply "PDO." Serving as the Resident Pastor at Faith Tabernacle, he considers it a **"divine privilege"** to not only lead the church but also oversee its vast network of cell fellowships.

While his public role is significant, his message is deeply personal, centring on the individual's walk with God.

## A Spiritual Journey, Not a Task

For Pastor Oyedepo Jnr., preparing for the Annual Youth Alive Convention (AYAC) goes far beyond a calendar event. **"It's not just about planning logistics; it's a spiritual journey,"** he explained.

He sees the convention as a moment for young people to prepare their hearts **"for an invasion of God's presence."**

His own preparation is a testament to this belief. **"I dedicate time to prayer and meditation... not merely to craft sermons... but to align myself with heaven's agenda."** He emphasised that "true consecration and spiritual investment are essential" for receiving all that God has in store.

## Faith is Cultivated, Not Inherited

Raised in a home steeped in faith, Pastor Oyedepo Jnr learnt a crucial lesson about his own spiritual journey.

He quickly realised that **"walking with God is not something you inherit—it's something you cultivate."**

Just because he grew up in a prayerful family didn't automatically make him prayerful. **"I had to take personal responsibility to invest in my spiritual growth,"** he said.

He views the **"battles of life"** as personal and believes that each individual must equip themselves with the necessary spiritual "weapons" to prevail.

## A Final Word:

To every young person, his final word was a simple but powerful command: **FOCUS!** He warned that life is "filled with distractions" that are always competing for our attention. He referenced Matthew 6:22-23, which states, **"The lamp of the body is the eye. If, therefore, your eye is good, your whole body will be full of light."**

He interpreted this to mean that "clarity and direction can only be accessed when your focus is right." He urged young people to "pursue God with intentionality, discipline, and a personal hunger. For him, a walk with God is the "greatest adventure", but it's a journey each person must "embrace individually." As we do, he assured us, God will grant us the grace to stand strong and fulfil our destiny.

**W**hat held me rooted in God was His grace. I recall a time when I still had the will to resist the call, to fight against what God was saying deep within my heart. But suddenly, all of that resistance just faded. It fizzled out completely. I found myself in a moment where I had to sit down and document the vision—everything God was saying to me about my future in that season. I wrote it all down, and then came the moment of presenting it before our father.

That presentation marked the beginning of a whole new season in my life. And that's the foundation I've been building on ever since.

It's been a beautiful journey. One of the most fulfilling parts has been working with young people, my true passion. I see so much value in them, and I genuinely desire to be part of their success story. There's an intense zeal within me to keep speaking, to keep contributing to the bright and beautiful future that lies ahead of our youth.

Not only is he the Design Team Lead at Faith Tabernacle, but he also serves as an executive in the Youth Alive Fellowship Media Team. Creating and handling cameras or writing stories are their core assignments.

When asked about how they operate during large events like AYAC, his passion was clear: **"During major events such as the Youth Convention, all our subgroups, ICT, Breakthrough Crew, Press & Publicity, Production, and Social Media, come together as one unified force. We function with excellence and with a clear sense of mission. That's why it works; we don't just 'do media', we run with the vision."**

### With a final word

**"Excellence is not just what we do; it's who we are. When people see our work, we want them to see the Kingdom. That's the real proof of success, not just that AYAC happened, but that it impacted lives indeed. If AYAC 2025 has shown us anything, it's that media is far more than cameras and screens. It's a ministry. Its impact. It's the power of telling the story of God's move in real time."**

The God of revelation?

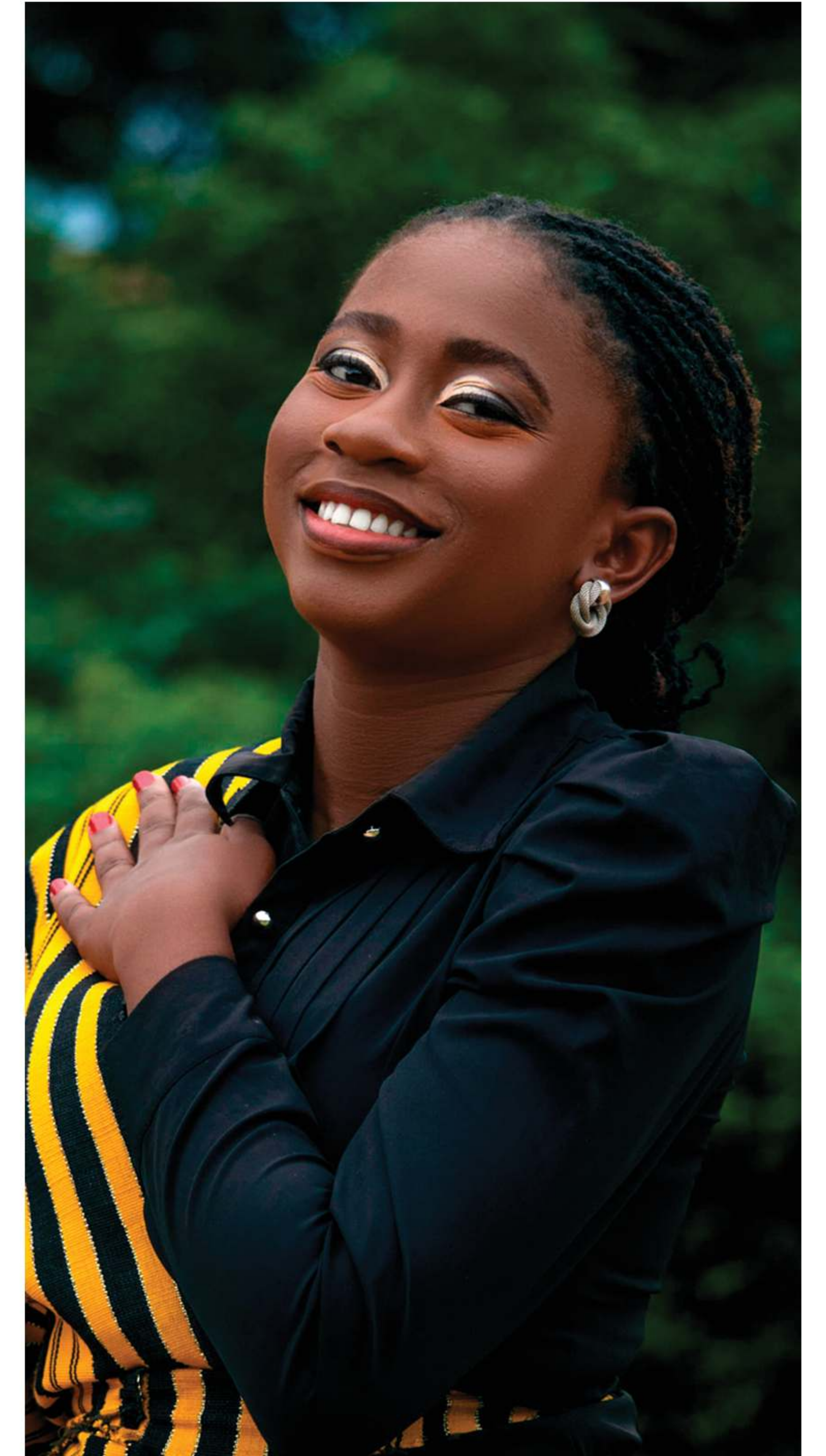
Have you met the Revelation 1:14 flame?

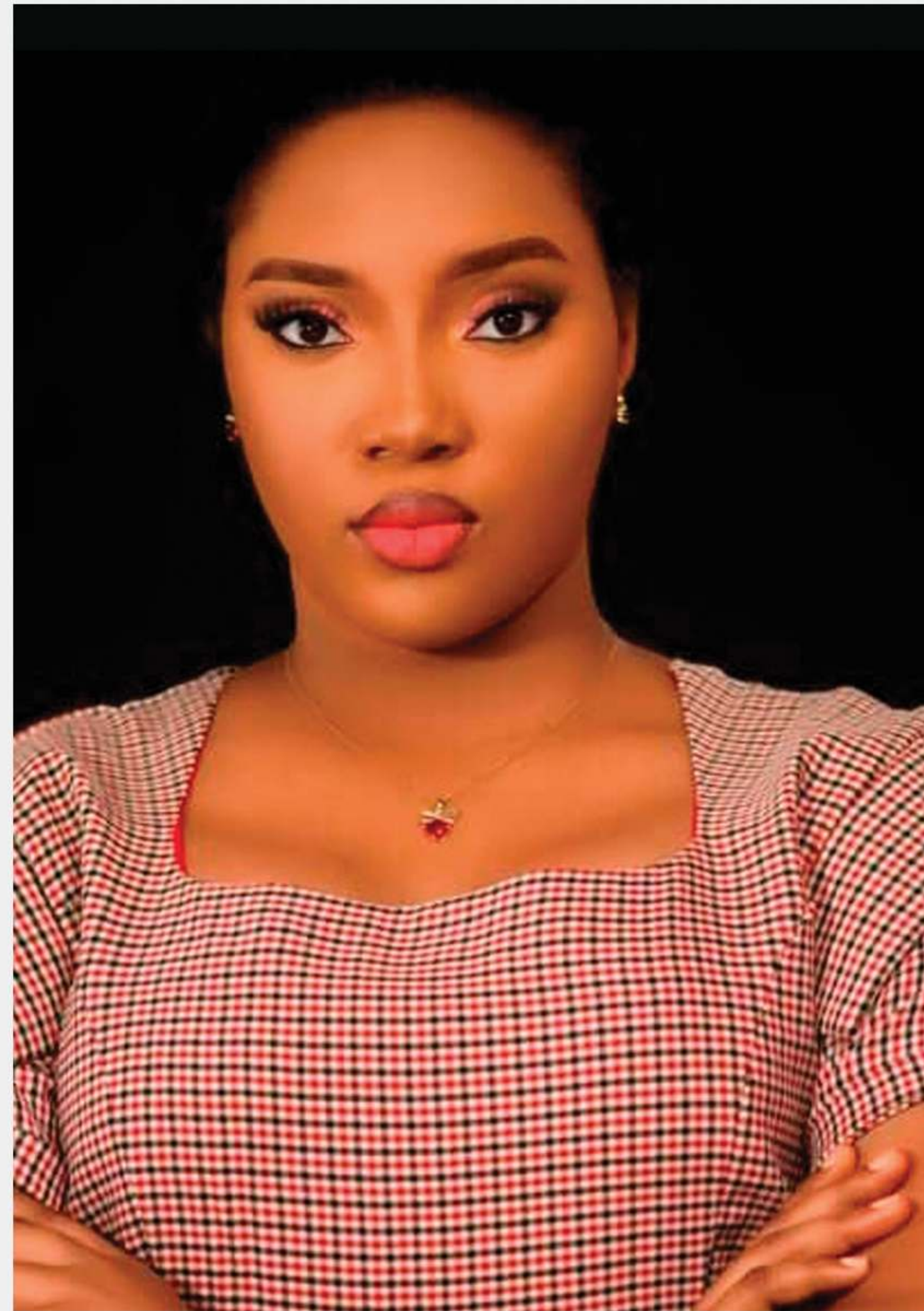
I have a dream

chasing life's amenities?

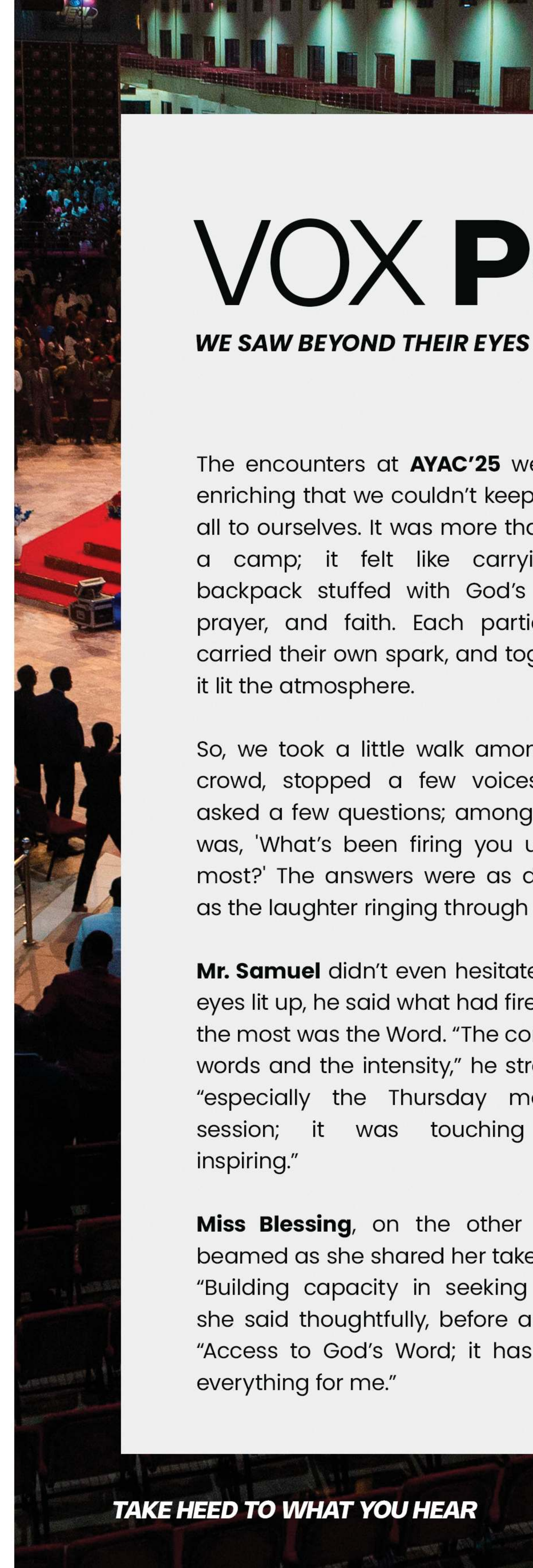

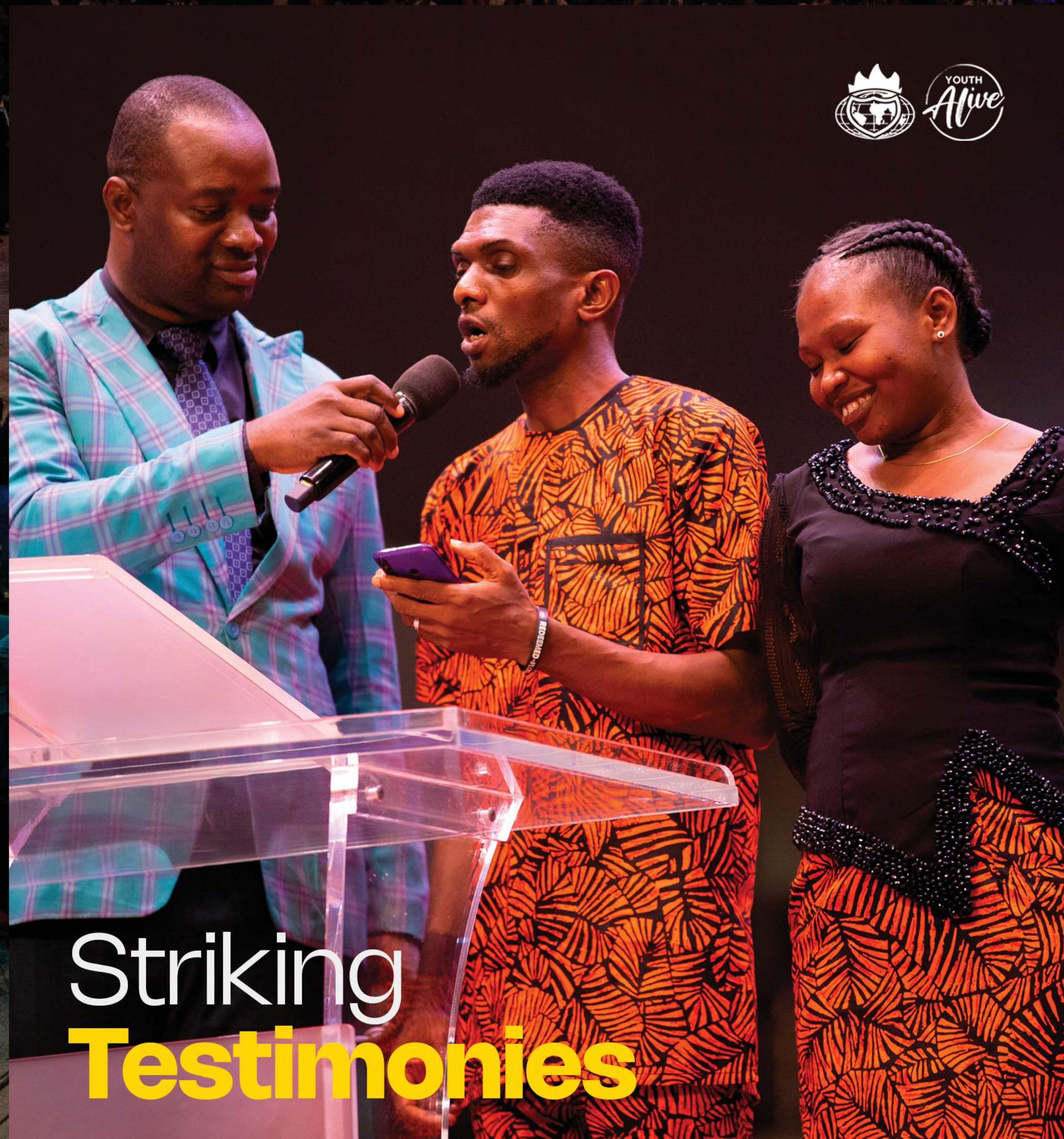

## Delivered from Addictions

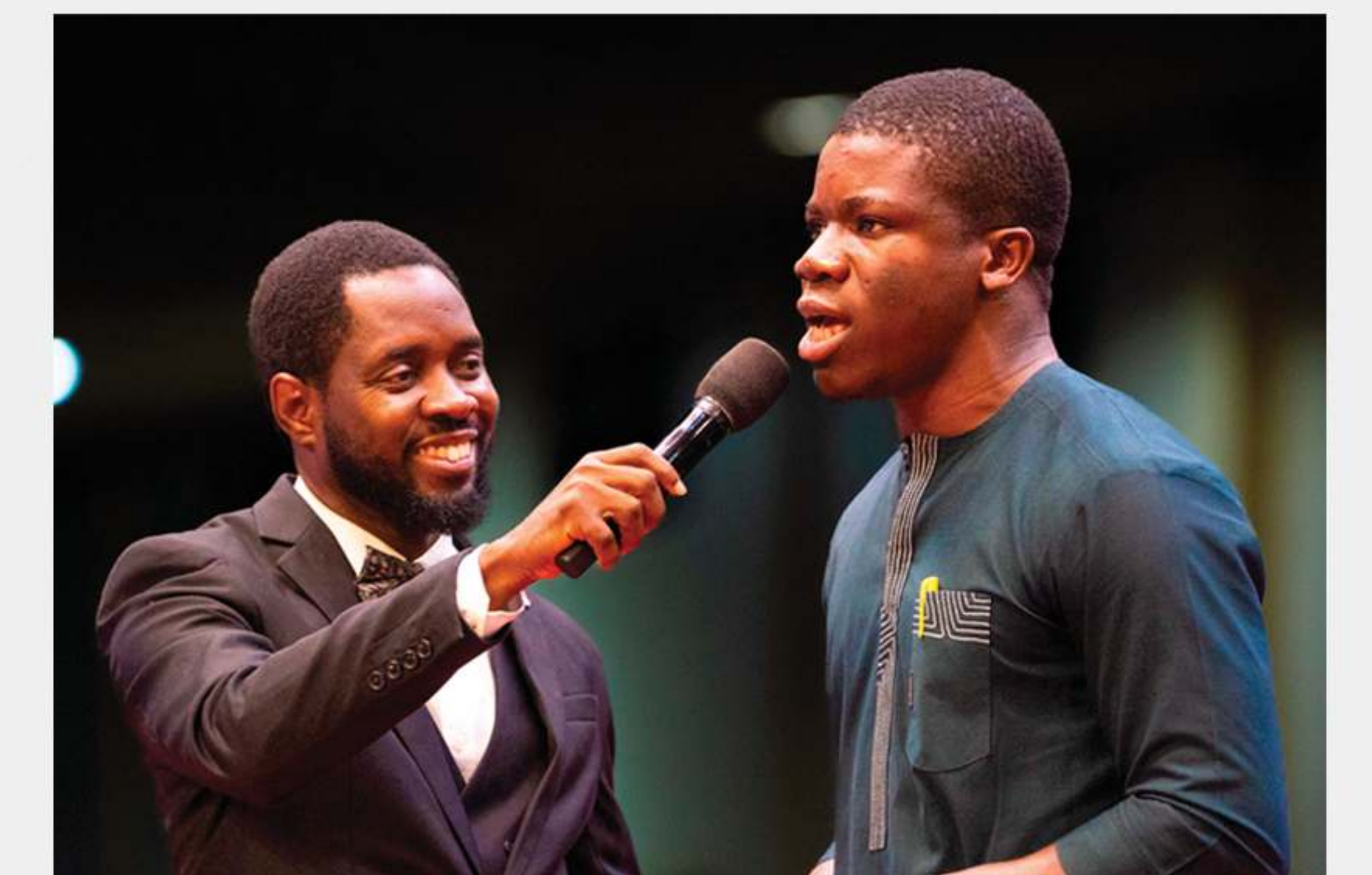
